Historic New England's **Watson Farm**

For millennia, Indigenous people lived well on Conanicut, using controlled burning to clear. Colonizers sought the

resulting grasslands for animals. These 265 acres were owned by three governors and worked by enslaved people and tenants. Starting in 1789, the Watsons owned the farm for five generations. Today, our farmers use innovative practices in the tradition of pastoral husbandry to raise cattle and sheep. Self-quided walking tours June 4 - October 12, Thursdays and Saturdays, 1:00 – 4:00.
