
Clean Up Safely!


- Always ask a trusted adult to help before starting a clean-up
- · Be careful on river banks or near roads
- Have adults handle dangerous items, such as glass or sharp objects
- Put glass and other sharp objects in a can to avoid injuries
 - Take rests from the sun or heat
 - Stay hydrated with water
 - Use garbage bags, and fill them all the way up, as they are also made with plastic
 - Do not touch yourself during the cleanup process, especially your face and skin
 - Put your clothes in the laundry after the clean-up



What to Wear!

- Wear well-fitting working gloves. Never pick up or touch any litter with bare hands
- Wear sturdy shoes; no flip-flops or open-toed shoes
- Do not wear a sleeveless shirt; instead wear long, non-baggy pants and a t-shirt
- · Do not wear jewelry because it could break
- Apply sunscreen before beginning, whether it is cloudy or sunny
- Apply and bring repellents against bugs to reapply throughout the clean-up.
- Don't forget to check for ticks afterwards






